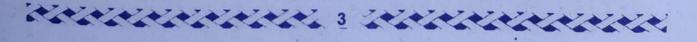
# MAYANG ANCHALIK COLLEGE A PROFILE

Mayang Anchalik College is a Degree (Arts) College which was established in 1992 in the village Rajamayang, P.O.- Rajamayang in the western part of the district of Morigaon, Assam. The college is permanently affiliated to Gauhati University. The Core Subjects offered by G.U. in the college are Economics, History, Political Science, Education and Elective Assamese. Major Courses are also available in all the subjects. The College has been included under schemes 2(f) & 12 (b) of UGC Act 1956. The College is situated at a distance of 42 Km. from Morigaon College, 35 Km from Jagiroad College, 35 Km from Dimoria College and 33 Km from Narengi Anchalik College. All roads to the College are pacca (Black topping). Since its inception, it has been dedicated to cater for the need of higher education to the poor and neddy students of the area. Now the college is the centre of excellence in imparting/expanding education among rural poor students.

# **ADMISSION PROCEDURE:-**

Students can apply for admission in the prescribed Admission Form. Admission to the sion to the college is strictly on the basis of merit and interview. The candidates need to submit the following testimonials in original during the time of admission.

\* Marks Sheet and Certificate of the qualifying examination in original. The ComScal

- \* Caste certificate (for those applying against quota)
- \* Gap Certificate for those who pass the qualifing examination earlier than the year in which admission is sought.
- \* Age Certificate.
- \* Certificate of Co-Curricular activities, if any.
- \* One Black & White and one coloured Passport size photographs.

  Selected candidates are required to deposit the prescribed Admission Fees at the cash counter for confirmation of Admission. Every student is issued an Identity Card which must be produced as and when necessary.

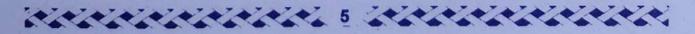
# **REGULATIONS CONCERNING STUDENTS' CONDUCT:**

- \* A student is required to attend all classes and tutorials.
- \* Use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the collegee campus.
- \* Exhibition or introduction of any political party emblem in the college premises is forbidden. Disciplinary action will be taken against a student resorting to such acts.
- \* Disciplinary action will also be taken against any student resorting to acts calculated to cause public nuisance, disturbance of public peace, law and or der.
- \* Any of the following acts by a student shall be considered as a major breach of discipline.
- \* Habitual unpunctuality.
- \* Any form of immoral act.
- \* Use of intoxicants, drugs etc. in the college premises or in any of the attached hostels.
- \* Resorting to violence of any kind.

Note:- Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the college premises or outside the campus. An individual or colletive act or practice of ragging shall be dealt with severely. An Anti-ragging committee as per UGC guidelines has already been constituted in the college.

# REGULATIONS GOVERNING COURSES IN THE COLLEGE:-

A student shall not be allowed to appear in the Degree Final Examination as a regular candidate if she/he has not attended a minimum of 80% of the lectures delivered in each subject. As per the decision of the GB, MAC, students with attendance less than 80% will be charged a fine of Rs. 100/- per subject, apart from the prescribed non-collegiate fees.



- A Student with attendance less than 60% is not eligible to appear in the final Examination. Such student shall be considered as non-collegiate/ dis-colle giate.
- \* Two sessional exams are conducted in the month of February and April for 2nd, 4th and 6th semester and in September and October for 1st, 3rd and 5th semester.
- For continuous evaluation of the performance of the students, the college conducts unit Tests and Terminal Examination.

#### **COLLEGE UNIFORM:**

- Boys should be dressed in white shirts and black formal pant.
- \* The dress code for girls are black salwar, white kamiz and black dupatta.
- Black blazer or cardigan during winter for both boys and girls.
- \* Jacket, Jeans and T- Shirts are not a part of the dress code.

A College "Logo" (which shall be supplied by college authority during admission period) has to be affixed by each student on shirt pocket position for boys and kamiz on right arm position for girls.

All students need to maintain the dress code of the college. No student shall be allowed to attend classes, festivals or any functions without proper uniform

# REMEDIAL CLASSES:-

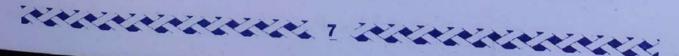
Remedial classes are provided for those who require guidance and help with certain subjects, Students belonging to SC/ST and other minority sections are encouraged to take the classes.

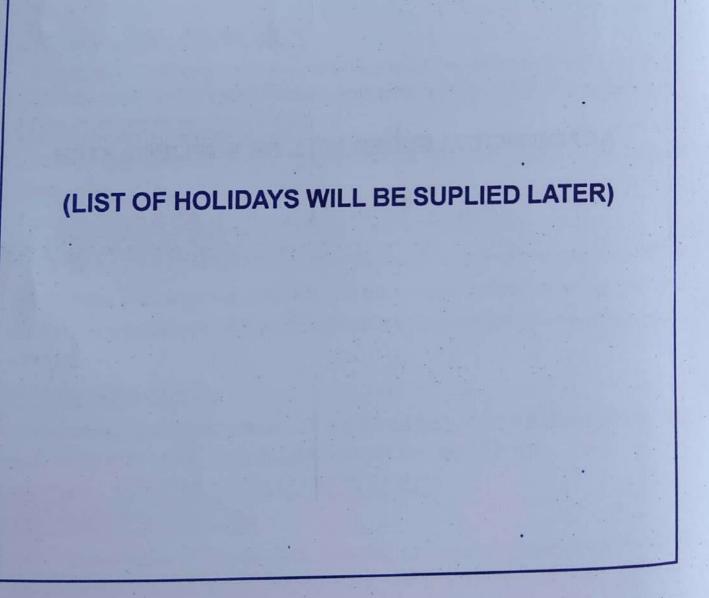

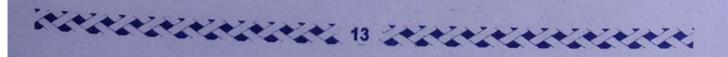

In the sixth semester there must be at least one paper where the students are given opportunity to apply their knowledge. The course may be designed that students' creativity is encouraged. This could be a small academic project, an advanced level practical work, literary survey on a topic, field survey work or any other work which may induce creativity among the child.

# **EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION:**

- The pass marks in each paper is 30% of total marks in the paper (External + internal)
- 2. A student who fails in one or more papers should repeat by the paper by attending all the calsses and by appearing for internal as well as external examinations at the next opportunity. A student shall get 3 chances for cleaning the papers within five years from the date of admission to the degree programme.
- A student who has completed a semester may be allowed to proceed to the next semester irrespective of number of papers where the student failed.
- 4. In order to complete a course a student must obtain pass marks in all the papers in the semesters offered to the students in the degree course
- A Student who fails in elective papers may be allowed to replace them by other elective papers of the same credit after obtaining prior approval from



the department. For this, the procedure for repeating (as in 2 above) would be applicable.

Students who secure the lowest grade (Viz. E Grade) may be given the
option to repeat the paper by following the procedure for repeating (as in 2.
Above).

## **Cumulative Performance Index (CPI):**

The final result of a four semester course is expressed as the average grade points obtained by the student in the entire course:

CPI={(CPA) Sem I + (GPA) Sem II+ (GPA) Sem III+ (GPA) Sem IV} /4

Conversion formula: For grade to percentage of marks for Humanities and

Social Science: For CGPA upto 9.5 (5 xCGPA) +20

For CGPA above 9.5 (5 xCGPA) - 550

For Class - I minimum CGPA required is 8.

For Class - II minimum CGPA required is 5.

# For other subjects/ disciplines:

For CGPA upto 9.00: (10 x CGPA) -5

For CGPA above 9.00 (15 x CGPA)-50

In order to qualify for a PG degree, a student must secure a minimum CGPA of 5.00 (evuivalent to 45% marks).

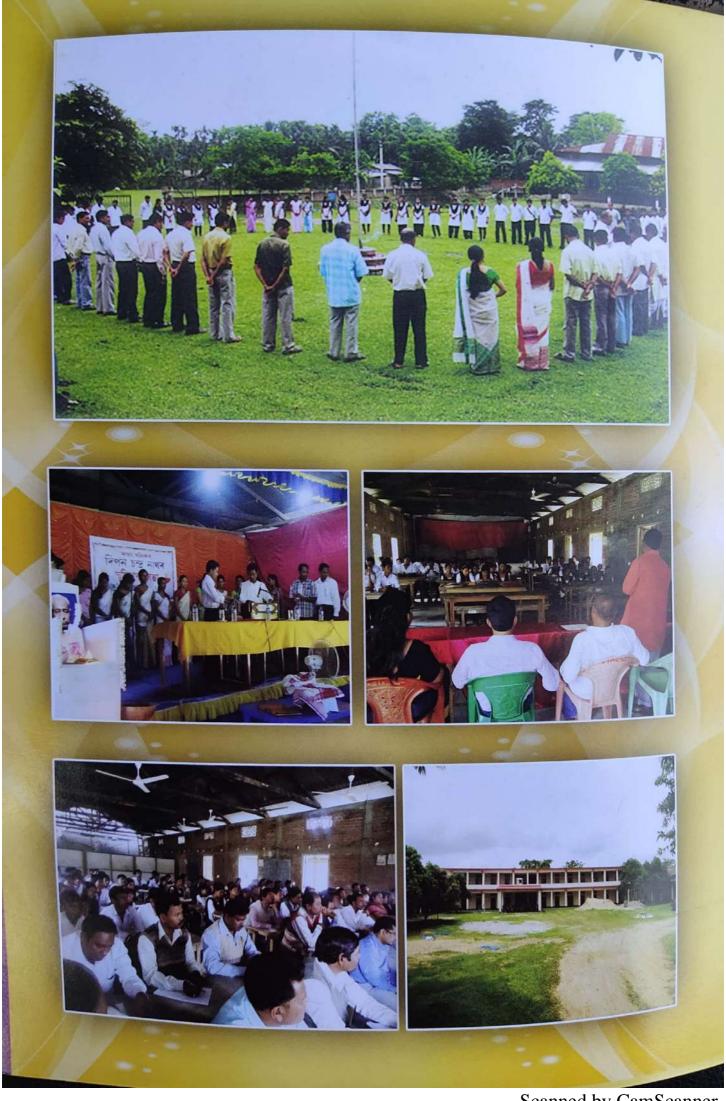
